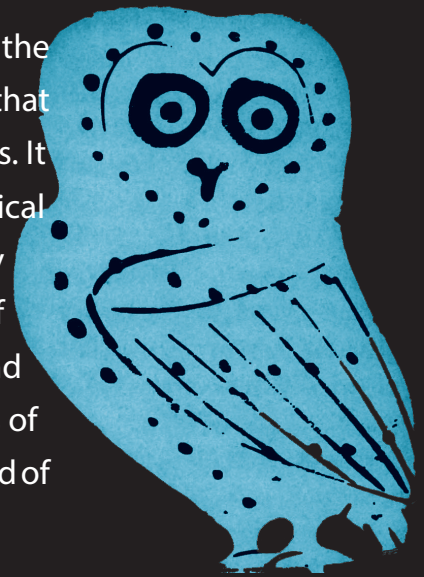


Journal of the History of Ideas
